All Saints Odiham is looking to hire a Children and Youth Paster to lead and envision discipleship amongst our flourishing children and youth.

All Saints is a lively, growing church in the market town of Odiham in North Hampshire, with a regular 'worshipping community' of about 160, of which 30 are under 18.

Our children's work is growing at an exciting pace, mainly on Sundays via our informal service in Odiham. This congregation, which was started 8 years ago, is experiencing steady growth and is charismatic evangelical in style.

Our vision is that every person across our community will discover more to life as they encounter Jesus, and we aim to realise our vision by growing in our faith, as authentic disciples of Jesus, sharing God's love, in practical ways in our community, and telling others about Jesus, that they would know his love. 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All Saints, Odiham

We are part of a larger benefice (North Hampshire Downs) of 12 local churches, but as Odiham accounts for half the overall population and has schools at all stages (infant/junior/secondary), most of our work with youth and children operates out of Odiham as a 'hub'.

Based on the range of schools and the exciting growth within the church, we believe that the scope for growing children and youth ministry here is huge.

We are looking for a passionate and experienced Children and Youth Pastor who will have a key focus on:



Discipling children and youth in church, in partnership with their homes/parents, with Odiham as hub and focus, plus some wider benefice.



Leading and building the Children and Youth team: Recruiting, training, equipping leaders.



Creating opportunities for children and youth across our community to engage with church (eg annual (huge) fete, schools, holiday club, after-school messy church. etc), working together with the benefice Youth Outreach Worker.

This post is full-time (5 days (37.5 hours) per week, to include Sundays).

Salary up to £35,000/year depending on experience and qualifications, plus housing allowance up to £5,000/year for in-benefice housing, and employers pension contributions into an existing pension or a new scheme.

Regular access to a mentor and training opportunities provided.

Post holder is expected to take at least 24 hours a week off.

Key Responsibilites

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All Saints, Odiham

The discipling and pastoring of children (0-11) and youth (11-18) who are already part of the church family, in partnership with their homes/parents, with Odiham as hub and focus, plus some wider benefice.

This will include creating and maintaining a fresh and modern curriculum for our Sunday morning and midweek groups in which children can have the opportunity to worship, pray and learn in ways appropriate to their age and abilities, particularly being aware of provision for those with additional needs; as well as building strong relationships with our young people and their whole families, inspiring them in ways to enable their children to grow in faith, e.g. through parenting courses etc.

Our aspiration is to see our community of youth and children deepening in faith - excited and growing in their faith in Jesus, participating regularly in Children's Church on Sundays and midweek youth groups, and wanting to bring their friends and family along to church.

The development and growth of the Children and Youth team - recruiting, training and equipping volunteer leaders.

This will include managing the practical oversight of our Sunday morning and midweek groups and other young people's events in the year, as well as inspiring our team of leaders, recruiting and training volunteers and creating rotas with clear and strong communication, and establishing a structure of policies to enable volunteers to deliver safe and high-quality teaching.

Our aspiration is to lead, train and equip a growing team of volunteer leaders, such that they are teaching and inspiring our young people to grow in faith and walk with Jesus throughout their lives, and enabling our young people to have fun and engaging times that they can't wait to come to!





Key Responsibilites

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All Saints, Odiham

The delivery of opportunities for children and youth across our community to engage with church (eg annual (huge) fete, schools, holiday club, after-school messy church. etc), working together with the benefice Youth Outreach Worker.

This will include leading weekly assemblies and groups at our infant and junior schools (already well established in Odiham) and growing the existing strong relationships with these schools - in conjunction with our benefice Youth Outreach Worker, and developing innovative ways to encourage and enthuse young people who are not yet part of our church family to get involved - for example through activities such as regular after-school messy church, our annual summer holiday club, and periodic community events such as our Odiham church fete (2,500 attendees), family film nights, toddler group etc.

Our hope is to see our Sunday Children's Church growing in number - from an average of about 15 under-11's every Sunday, to more than 30 within 3 years; and to see our weekly youth (11-18) discipleship group grow from a weekly average of 8 to 20 within 3 years.

The role will require close liaison with our Youth Outreach Worker, who has a particular brief to plan and deliver detached youth work across the benefice, to lead in evangelism and outreach to young people across the benefice, and to develop a wide ranging programme of mentoring, listening and support services for children and young people in the benefice particularly through **Robert Mays School** (secondary).

Qualities & Beliefs

- Understand and be able to commit to All Saints Odiham's Christian vision, values and culture. There is a genuine occupational requirement that the post holder has a Christian faith.
- Be willing to participate in staff meetings, weekly staff prayers, and be a participative member of All Saints Odiham's Ministry Team
- Have the capacity to work sensitively with a wide range of people and to contribute to the spiritual direction of All Saints Odiham
- Be willing to learn continuously

Skills & Qualifications

Essential:

- Be an inspirational and innovative leader, able to inspire children and families, but also able to re-imagine discipleship of children and youth at All Saints and the wider benefice.
- Have a minimum of 3 years experience of working with children and youth in a church setting.
- Be a strong and gifted communicator to both young people and adults alike
- Have theological training, ideally with specialism in children's ministry.
- Have experience leading and building teams.
- Have some experience in event or project management.
- Be skilled in working collaboratively and effectively in a team, whilst also happy and able to maintain energy and proactive output when working on their own.
- Be adaptable and flexible in a changing work environment.
- Demonstrate pastoral sensitivity and confidentiality.
- Enjoy working as part of a team.
- Be creative and imaginative and willing to try new approaches.
- Possess good time management and organisational skills, able to work to deadlines and under pressure and manage conflicting deadlines and priorities; able to cope calmly with last minute needs.
- Have a good knowledge of child protection and safeguarding issues and be a
 persuasive advocate and champion for safeguarding policies of the C of E.
- Have knowledge of health and safety issues and be able to plan events with close adherence to health and safety regulations.
